From Fr. Jay - Overcoming Greed during Lent

Part of the Lenten season is addressing our attachment to worldly possessions and wealth. One of the reasons for almsgiving that I wrote about last week, is to help us live more simple lives. I am sure that none of us would easily say, "I am a greedy person," yet, if we do an honest examination of our consciences, we might discover that greed is something that can easily creep into our lives.

Let's start with the 10th Commandment, which says that we should not covet our neighbor's possessions. It touches upon what is in our heart, what we crave and desire. Let us remember what our Lord said – "Where your treasure is, there will your heart be." Now let us be clear, there is nothing wrong with having things, nice things even, but we must always ask ourselves, "do I own them, or do they own me?" Am I overcome with a need to have the newest, most expensive, name brand and does that desire dictate my spending and priorities?

Greed and envy lead us to acquiring possessions without any limit, especially when there are others who are going without. We could point to countless examples today where corporate greed is controlling our markets while those on fixed incomes, especially our elderly are being forced to make difficult decisions. But it is easy to point at the obvious greed of others, and more difficult to address how we are complicit with that, even on the smallest scale.

As we mark the halfway point of Lent, let us go a bit deeper than the normal surface level approaches to Lent. Let us truly strive to root out all greed and envy and materialism from our lives. Let us ask ourselves questions like: Do I really need this? Could I spend my money differently? Is there someone in need that I could help right now, directly or anonymously? Where has greed crept into my life? Am I envious of the things that others have? Am I living simply?

These are not easy questions and at first can be either easily dismissed or we might even find them offensive, but if we are truly trying to grow in holiness and faith, these are questions that we need to ask and ask them to ourselves this Lent. None of us wants to be labeled as either greedy or envious, and so let us really give this some honest thought.

Do Pe. Jay - A Ganância Durante a Quaresma

Parte da época da Quaresma é abordar nosso apego às posses e riquezas mundanas. Uma das razões para dar esmolas sobre as quais escrevi na semana passada é para nos ajudar a viver vidas mais simples. Tenho certeza de que nenhum de nós diria facilmente: "Sou uma pessoa gananciosa", mas, se fizermos um exame honesto de nossa consciência, podemos descobrir que a ganância é algo que pode facilmente se infiltrar em nossas vidas.

Vamos começar com o 10° Mandamento, que diz que não devemos cobiçar os bens do nosso próximo. Ele toca o que está em nosso coração, o que ansiamos e desejamos. Lembremo-nos do que nosso Senhor disse – "Onde estiver o seu tesouro, aí estará o seu coração". Agora vamos ser claros, não há nada de errado em ter coisas, coisas boas até, mas devemos sempre nos perguntar: "eu as possuo ou elas me possuem?" Estou superado com a necessidade de ter a marca mais nova e mais cara e esse desejo dita meus gastos e prioridades?

A ganância e a inveja nos levam a adquirir posses sem limites, especialmente quando há outros que estão ficando sem. Poderíamos apontar inúmeros exemplos hoje em que a ganância corporativa está controlando nossos mercados enquanto aqueles em renda fixa, especialmente nossos idosos, estão sendo forçados a tomar decisões difíceis. Mas é fácil apontar para a óbvia ganância dos outros e mais difícil abordar como somos cúmplices disso, mesmo em menor escala.

À medida que marcamos a metade do caminho da Quaresma, vamos um pouco mais fundo do que o nível normal da superfície se aproxima da Quaresma. Vamos realmente nos esforçar para erradicar toda a ganância, inveja e materialismo de nossas vidas. Façamos a nós mesmos perguntas como: Eu realmente preciso disso? Posso gastar meu dinheiro de forma diferente? Existe alguém precisando que eu possa ajudar agora, diretamente ou anonimamente? Onde a ganância se infiltrou na minha vida? Tenho inveja das coisas que os outros têm? Estou vivendo de forma simples?

Essas não são perguntas fáceis e, a princípio, podem ser facilmente descartadas ou até mesmo ofensivas, mas se estamos realmente tentando crescer em santidade e fé, essas são perguntas que precisamos fazer e perguntar a nós mesmos nesta Quaresma. Nenhum de nós quer ser rotulado como ganancioso ou invejoso, então vamos realmente pensar nisso com honestidade.
