ANNUAL MASS ATTENDANCE COUNT

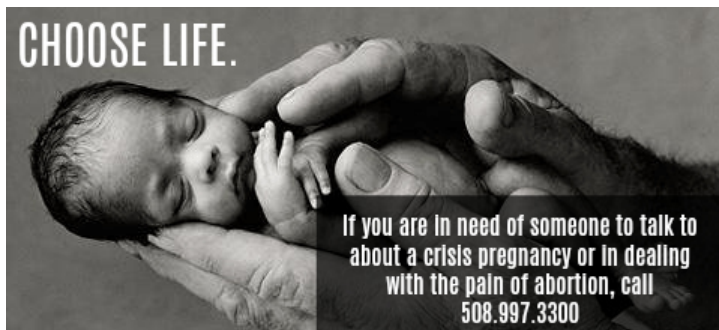
