PALM SUNDAY

We remember our Lord's entrance into the Jerusalem, where is He welcomed by His disciples who are waving palms and shouting "Hosanna in the Highest." Mass begins at the entrance of the Church with the blessing of the palms and the solemn entrance. We hear the Gospel reading of our Lord's betrayal by Judas, His arrest and His crucifixion. We encourage everyone to actively participate. As we take palms home with us, let us remember that those who once wave them welcoming Christ into Jerusalem later shouted, "Crucify Him." Let these palms be a reminder to us to always be faithful to Jesus Christ and His Gospel.

HOLY THURSDAY

We commemorate our Lord's Last Supper in which He celebrated the Eucharist for the very first time. It is also the day in which He also instituted the sacred priesthood to continue His work – to teach, govern and sanctify His people. At this Mass, we also remember the day in which our Lord washed the feet of His Twelve Apostles. Because of the Pandemic, this will not take place this year. Nonetheless, this profound gesture of our Lord should remind us that we are all called to serve one another. with the Eucharist so that each of us may spend time in Eucharistic Adoration – spending time with our Lord. Eucharistic Adoration will end at 10pm at St. Joseph's and at 11pm at St. Michael's.

GOOD FRIDAY

We remember the day our Lord suffered and died for our us and for our sins. It is a day of prayer and fasting (only one meal & NO meat). It is a day that should be observed with particular devotion that is fitting for what we are remembering – the death of our Lord Jesus Christ. As such, we have a number of opportunities throughout the day to help us to stay focused. The traditional Stations of the Cross will be offered at 12noon at St. Joseph's. This is the only day of the year in which Mass is not celebrated, instead, we have a "Service." After the Gospel come forward to venerate the Cross. In an act of humility and piety, we remove our shoes (if we are able) and come forward to Venerate the cross, after first genuflecting to show our love and devotion. Please do not kiss the cross this year! The service will be offered at 3pm at St. Joseph's (The hour in which our Lord died) and at 7pm at St. Michaels.

HOLY SATURDAY

This is the holiest night of the year in which we as Christians hold vigil awaiting the resurrection of Christ from the dead. The service begins with the Church in darkness and the Easter Fire at the entrance of the Church. We bless the Easter Candle – the symbol of Christ as the light of the world. We hear the readings of Salvation History and how God has saved us from our sins. We welcome new Catholics into our community at this Mass and we celebrate with them the most important event in human history, the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. Mass at each parish is offered at 7pm.

EASTER SUNDAY

HE IS RISEN! Today we celebrate the central mystery of Christianity! Today we recall the overwhelming sense of joy that each of our Lord's disciples experienced when they saw Him raised from the dead. This is a wonderful time for families to gather together, especially at Holy Mass. The Sunday Mass schedule is the same as every Sunday, except there is NO 7PM MASS.

FOLLOWING GUIDELINES AT MASS

We ask that you please review our guidelines for opening our churches during the current health situation, and continued to wear your masks and observe social distancing. Please use hand sanitizer upon entrance and exit of church, as well as before and after receiving Holy Communion. Please refrain from any form of the Sign of Peace. Please use only center aisle for Communion.

BLESSING OF MARRIAGES

Baptized Catholics are to marry in a Church or chapel with a priest or deacon officiating. Without a proper dispensation from the bishop, Catholics who are married by non-Catholic ministers (such as a Justice of the Peace) or not married in a Church are not considered by the Church as validly joined in a sacramental marriage. The same holds true for divorced Catholics who remarry without first obtaining an annulment from their first marriage. Those who find themselves in such situations are considered to be in a state of grave sin, and should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until the situation is resolved. As these cases are becoming more and more common it presents many issues, including when someone in such a situation wishes to be a godparent for a baptism or confirmation, and does not qualify. The Church, in her mercy, seeks to reconcile all situations and provides the means necessary to do so. whether the annulment process for those who are divorced, or the convalidation (blessing) of those civilly married. For those who find themselves in such a situation, and wish to remedy the situation, please speak directly with Fr. Jay.

DOMINGO DE RAMOS

Lembramos a entrada de nosso Senhor em Jerusalém, onde é recebido por Seus discípulos que estão agitando as palmas das mãos e gritando "Hosana nas alturas". A missa começa na entrada da Igreja com a bênção das palmas e a solene entrada. Ouvimos a leitura do Evangelho sobre a traição de nosso Senhor por Judas, Sua prisão e crucificação. Nós encorajamos todos a participarem ativamente. Ao levarmos as palmas para casa conosco, lembremo-nos de que aqueles que uma vez acenaram para dar as boas-vindas a Cristo em Jerusalém, mais tarde gritaram: "Crucifica-O". Que essas palmas sejam um lembrete para nós sempre sermos fiéis a Jesus Cristo e Seu Evangelho.

OUINTA-FEIRA SANTA

Comemoramos a Última Ceia de nosso Senhor, na qual Ele celebrou a Eucaristia pela primeira vez. É também o dia em que Ele também instituiu o sagrado sacerdócio para continuar Sua obra - para ensinar, governar e santificar Seu povo. Nesta missa, também nos lembramos do dia em que nosso Senhor lavou os pés de Seus Doze Apóstolos. Por causa da Covid, isso não acontecerá este ano. Este gesto profundo de nosso Senhor deve nos lembrar que todos nós somos chamados a servir uns aos outros. Porque o foco central desta Missa é a Eucaristia, observaremos a antiga tradição de ajoelhar para receber a Sagrada Comunhão na língua, para colocar maior ênfase no que estamos fazendo quando recebemos a Sagrada Comunhão - receber o próprio Cristo. A missa terminará com uma procissão pela Igreja com a Eucaristia para que cada um de nós possa passar algum tempo na Adoração Eucarística - passando tempo com o Senhor. A Adoração Eucarística terminará às 10 da noite em São José e às 11 da noite em São Miguel.

SEXTA-FEIRA SANTA

Lembramos o dia em que nosso Senhor sofreu e morreu por nós e por nossos pecados. É um dia de oração e jejum (apenas uma refeição e SEM carne). É um dia que deve ser observado com particular devoção e adequado para o que estamos lembrando - a morte de nosso Senhor Jesus Cristo. Como tal, temos várias oportunidades ao longo do dia para nos ajudar a manter o foco. A tradicional Via-Sacra será oferecida ao meio-dia na Basílica de São José. Este é o único dia do ano em que não é celebrada missa. em vez disso, temos um "serviço religioso". Depois do Evangelho, venham à frente para venerar a Cruz. Em um ato de humildade e piedade, tiramos nossos sapatos (se pudermos) e avançamos para Venerar a cruz, após a primeira genuflexão para mostrar nosso amor e devoção. Por favor, não beije a cruz este ano! O serviço será oferecido às 3 horas em St. Jose (a hora em que nosso Senhor morreu) e às 7 horas da noite em S. Miguel.

SÁBADO DE ALELUIA

Esta é a noite mais sagrada do ano em que nós, como cristãos, vigiamos aguardando a ressurreição de Cristo dentre os mortos. O serviço começa com a Igreja nas trevas e o Fogo da Páscoa na entrada da Igreja. Bendizemos a vela da Páscoa - o símbolo de Cristo como a luz do mundo. Ouvimos as leituras da História da Salvação e como Deus nos salvou de nossos pecados. Recebemos novos católicos em nossa comunidade nesta missa e celebramos com eles o evento mais importante da história da humanidade, a ressurreição de Jesus Cristo dentre os mortos. A missa em cada paróquia é oferecida às 7 horas.

DOMINGO DE PÁSCOA RESSUSCITOU!

Hoje celebramos o mistério central do Cristianismo! Hoje, lembramos a imensa sensação de alegria que cada um dos discípulos de nosso Senhor experimentou quando O viram ressuscitado dos mortos. Este é um momento maravilhoso para as famílias se reunirem, especialmente na Santa Missa. O horário da Missa dominical é o mesmo de todos os Domingos, exceto que **NÃO** há missa das 7 da noite.

Pedimos que reveja nossas diretrizes para abrir nossas igrejas durante a atual situação de saúde, e continue a usar suas máscaras e observar o distanciamento social.
