PALM SUNDAY

THE IMPORTANCE OF HOLY WEEK

This weekend we celebrate Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week, the holiest week of the year for us as Christians. It is the time of year in which we remember the sacred events of Christ's Passion, Death and Resurrection – the very heart of our of Christian Faith. I encourage you and your family to attend all of the events of Holy Week as a way of living out our Catholic Faith and putting God first in our lives by observing these sacred events with devotion, reverence and piety.

PALM SUNDAY

We remember our Lord's entrance into the Jerusalem, where He welcomed by His disciples who are waving palms and shouting "Hosanna in the Highest." Mass begins at the entrance of the Church with the blessing of the palms and the solemn entrance. We hear the Gospel reading of our Lord's betrayal by Judas, His arrest and His crucifixion. Unlike the rest of the year, the Gospel is read in parts, with the congregation taking the part of the Crowd. We encourage everyone to actively participate. As we take palms home with us, let us remember that those who once waved them welcoming Christ into Jerusalem later shouted, "Crucify Him." Let these palms be a reminder to us to always be faithful to Jesus Christ and His Gospel

HOLY THURSDAY

We commemorate our Lord's Last Supper in which He celebrated the Eucharist for the very first time. It is also the day in which He also instituted the sacred priesthood to continue His work – to teach, govern and sanctify His people. At this Mass, we also remember the day in which our Lord washed the feet of His Twelve Apostles. Men from our community have been asked to represent the original twelve in having their feet washed. This is both a humbling experience and a great honor. This profound gesture of our Lord should remind us that we are all called to serve one another. Because the central focus of this Mass is Eucharist, we will observe the ancient tradition of kneeling to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, to place greater emphasis on what it is that we are doing when we receive Holy Communion – receiving Christ himself. Mass will end with a procession through the Church with the Eucharist so that each of us may spend time in Eucharistic Adoration – spending time with our Lord. Eucharistic Adoration will end at 10pm at St. Joseph's and at 11pm at St. Michael's. Other churches throughout the city will also have altars set up for adoration, commemorating the ancient tradition of visiting 7 churches on Holy Thursday evening.

GOOD FRIDAY

We remember the day our Lord suffered and died for our us and for our sins. It is a day of prayer and fasting (only one meal & NO meat). It is a day that should be observed with particular devotion that is fitting for what we are remembering – the death of our Lord Jesus Christ. As such, we have a number of opportunities throughout the day to help us to stay focused. The "Romeiros," a group of several hundred people will be walking to each church in the city, continuing the great Azorean tradition. They will be praying at St. Michaels at 10am and at St. Joseph's at 11am. I invite you to gather on the steps of each Church to welcome them and observe this very moving tradition. The traditional Stations of the Cross will be offered at 12noon at St. Joseph's. This is the only day of the year in which Mass is not celebrated, instead, we have a "Service." During the Good Friday Service we hear the Lord's Passion as we did on Palm Sunday, with the Gospel being read in parts. After the Gospel come forward to venerate the Cross. In an act of humility and piety, we remove our shoes (if we are able) and come forward to kiss the cross, after first genuflecting to show our love and devotion. The service will be offered at 3pm at St. Joseph's (The hour in which our Lord died) and at 7pm at St. Michaels. After the service at St. Michael's there will be the traditional "funeral procession" with the statue of the "Dead Christ" (*Sua Morte*) as the lamentations of Veronica are sung. This is one of the most powerful and beautiful traditions that we have.

HOLY SATURDAY

This is the holiest night of the year in which we as Christians hold vigil awaiting the resurrection of Christ from the dead. The service begins with the Church in darkness and the Easter Fire at the entrance of the Church. We bless the Easter Candle – the symbol of Christ as the light of the world. We hear the readings of Salvation History and how God has saved us from our sins. We welcome new Catholics into our community at this Mass and we celebrate with them the most important event in human history, the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. Mass at each parish is offered at 7pm.

EASTER SUNDAY

HE IS RISEN! Today we celebrate the central mystery of Christianity! Today we recall the overwhelming sense of joy that each of our Lord's disciples experienced when they saw Him raised from the dead. This is a wonderful time for families to gather together, especially at Holy Mass. The Sunday Mass schedule is the same as every Sunday, except there is NO 7PM MASS.

STATUES

You will have noticed that all of the statues in the Church have been covered, and will be so until the Easter Vigil. It might seem strange that during the most sacred time of year we cover everything that is beautiful in our church, even the crucifix. Shouldn't we be looking at the painful scene at Calvary while we listen to the Passion narrative on Palm Sunday? While it may appear counterintuitive to veil statues and images during the final weeks of Lent, the Church recommends this practice to heighten our senses and build within us a longing for Easter Sunday. It is a tradition that should not only be carried out in our local parish, but can also be a fruitful and pious activity for you to do in your homes as well.

PALM SUNDAY EASTER EGG HUNT PARTY

On Sunday, April 14th, there will be an Easter Egg Hunt at St. Joseph's Church parking lot after 10:45AM Mass, weather permitting. In the case of inclement weather, we will be decorating eggs in the parish hall. All children are invited to join in the fun.
